Alternate Streams is one of those albums that confirms how inclusive jazz is with standards that are constantly evolving. Here the magnificent Sangoma Everett and Christophe Lincontang bring all their sensitivity to build a playful dialogue with Jérôme Lefebvre. After and energetic opening that has nothing to envy to rock, the guitarist delivers to us the diversity of sources that inspire him. With this original setting, the three musicians build a jubilant "interplay" in which groove, harmonies and melodies combine joyfully at the moment.

Jérôme Lefebvre is a jazz guitarist who distinguishes himself by the acoustic as well as electric approach of his instrument. Also a composer, his organic relationship to sound makes him consider music as an object that the musician sculpts according to the mood of the moment. Thus he happily combines energy and sophistication. Very inspired by American and European jazzmen among whom he finds his mentors, he is also involved in innovative projects for which he willingly challenges himself. Each new adventure enriches his experience and he develops his own directions by challenging melodies, harmonies, metrics and timbres in a very stimulating relationship with his bandmates. He constantly opens jazz to other aesthetics and his eclecticism naturally expresses itself in the service of invention. Free and mischievous, he is an artist who likes to share with the public the pleasure and the jubilation of living the present time.
